

## **Position for a Clinician Scientist in the Division of Cardiovascular and Metabolic Diseases**

The Clinical Research Institute of Montreal (IRCM - Institut de recherches cliniques de Montréal) has an immediate opening for a **Clinician Scientist in the Division of Cardiovascular and Metabolic Diseases**. The successful candidate should hold an MD or MD/PhD degree and be eligible for medical licensure in Quebec. Candidates holding a PhD who specialize in clinical research will also be considered.

The candidate's research focus may include, but is not limited to, clinical and physiological research, genetic predisposition, molecular mechanisms of atherosclerosis or plaque instability, metabolic syndrome (including obesity, dyslipidemia or diabetes) or the therapeutic potential of stem cells.

The IRCM is a world-class independent research institute affiliated with the University of Montreal and located in one of North America's most desirable cities. In addition to state-of-the-art research facilities, the institute houses an ambulatory clinic equipped with clinical research facilities and an advanced metabolic phenotyping platform (PROMD). This platform consists of an exercise facility as well as short-term beds for physiological studies and offers the possibility of obtaining precise measurements of body composition and metabolic status.

The successful candidate will be eligible for a faculty appointment at the University of Montreal and McGill University. Start-up funds, including equipment, laboratory space and salaries, as well as access to our clinics will be provided. Proficiency in both English and French is preferable.
